Below is a description of each part of the DIBELS assessment for reading screening.

Letter Naming Fluency (Kindergarten and Grade 1 reports only) LNF measures a child's ability to say the names of letters from a printed page.

Phoneme Segmentation Fluency (Kindergarten and Grade 1 reports only) PSF measures phonemic awareness, the ability to hear and manipulate sounds in spoken words.

Nonsense Word Fluency – Correct Letter Sounds (Grades 1 and 2 reports, and some Kindergarten reports) NWF-CLS measures basic phonics skills.

Nonsense Word Fluency – Words Recoded Correctly (Grades 1 and 2 reports, and some Kindergarten reports) NWF-WRC measures basic phonics and blending skills.

Oral Reading Fluency – Words Correct (Grade 2 reports, and some Grade 1 reports) ORF measures the ability to read accurately and automatically.

Oral Reading Fluency – Accuracy (Grade 2 reports, and some Grade 1 reports) ORF accuracy is the percent of words the student reads correctly.

Word Reading Fluency (Grades 1 and 2 reports, and some Kindergarten reports) WRF measures the ability to read grade-level words from a page.

Maze – Adjusted Score (Grade 2 Students only) Maze is a measure of reading comprehension.

DIBELS 8 Composite Score DIBELS Composite is a combination of scores on multiple DIBELS measures.

Support for Families

For Kindergarten Reports: **Practice at home.** Reading with young students helps them practice phonemic awareness, phonics, letter naming, vocabulary skills and listening comprehension.

For Grade 1 Reports: **Practice at home.** Reading aloud with a student can help build phonics skills, vocabulary, fluency and reading comprehension skills.

For Grade 2 Reports: **Practice at home**. Reading aloud with students can help build vocabulary and reading comprehension skills.
