Dear Parent/Guardian of a Magnet Student who has accepted a seat offer:

On behalf of the Office of Advanced Studies and Programs, I would like to welcome you and your child to the Magnet Program. The last step in being accepted into a Magnet Program is the registration process. All students who accept a seat in a Magnet Program *must* attend a “Magnet Welcome and Registration Night” for their assigned Magnet school. In accordance with AACPS Board Policy and Regulation (JABRA) *Assignment and/or Transfer of Students to a School*, we request that you please follow the instructions outlined below in order to complete the registration process. Our Policy and Regulations can be viewed on our website www.aacps.org.

Determine the category of your child’s enrollment type and submit accordingly:

If your child...	Provide...
currently attends an AACPS school	2 proofs of residency - See Section A , below
currently attends a non-AACPS school	2 proofs of residency - See Section A , below, <i>along with</i> the documents outlined in Section B below

Section A - Proof of residency documentation for AACPS students: **Please bring with you copies of the requested documents to the Welcome and Registration Evening. You must provide this documentation when enrolling in a Magnet Program, even if you currently attend an AACPS school.**

Two proofs of residency will be needed; one from List 1 and one from List 2.

List 1 Choose **one** form of documentation from the list below:

- Mortgage document (issued within 60 calendar days)
- Deed
- Valid rental agreement (current lease agreement signed by landlord)
- Military housing lease, or
- Tenant Residency Verification form (TRV) with supporting documentation

List 2 Choose **one** form of documentation from the list below:

- Utility/cable bill or work order (within the last 60 days)
- Current bank statement (within the last 60 days)
- Valid Commercial Driver’s License (**NOT** a personal Driver’s License)
- W-2 Form or Form 1099 issued previous year
- Social Security check
- Domestic Relations (child support) check
- DSS documentation: Food Stamps or Community Medical Assistance letter
- Unemployment award
- Current paystub

Section B – Additional Proof of residency documentation for **non-AACPS students only:**

If your child does not currently attend an AACPS school, in addition to the residency documentation above, you will also be required to provide the following copies at Welcome and Registration Night. **Please bring copies with you:**

- Proof of birth
- Transcripts (even if you submitted during the application process)
- Standardized test scores (even if you submitted during the application process)
- Immunization/medical records
- Other special documentation (e.g., IEP, 504 Plan, BIP Plan, custody documents, etc.)

Once your child accepts a seat in a Magnet Program, a set curriculum for most of your child’s classes will be outlined at the Magnet School. At Welcome and Registration Night, you will:

- Complete a Magnet registration form as part of the course selection process
- Sign a Magnet Commitment Contract
- Review requirements specific to the Magnet Program
- Receive information regarding any summer programs for your child

All courses that your child takes are aligned with Maryland’s graduation requirements. If your child will not be a rising Grade 6 or rising Grade 9 student for the upcoming academic year, please consult with the school Counselor or the Registrar during the Welcome and Registration Night. See chart above to determine the date and location of your Magnet school’s “Welcome and Registration Night.”
